NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. All students in these year levels participate in tests in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. They also provide schools, states and territories with information about how education programs are working and which areas need to be prioritised for improvement.

NAPLAN tests are <u>one aspect</u> of each school's assessment and reporting process; they <u>do not replace</u> the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance.

The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. The NAPLAN tests will be administered for all children in Years 3 and 5 on the schedule shown below.

In 2021, the NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 11 -13 May.

Thank you to all the volunteers we have had so far and if you are able to help out please don't forget to sign up on Xuno.


