Junior School 100 Days of School!

Can you believe that the Preps have been at school for 100 days!

We celebrated 100 days of Prep on Monday the 22nd of July by coming to school dressed as a 100-year-old person. We took the day as a wonderful opportunity to reflect on our growth as learners.

We used strategies to count 100 blocks efficiently by skip counting in 10s and then making something creative with our 100 blocks.

Here's what a few of the Preps reflected on about their learning and some of the things we made using 100 things:

Lily

I am 100 days **SMARTER!** I now know how to write information reports, letters and books.

I am a self-manager. Learning is **GREAT!**

Malakai

I have been learning for 100 days. I am the **BEST** learner. I love all the students!

Juniper

I am a learner, and I am 100 Days **SMARTER!** I can write and I know how to count 100 + 100 = 200.

Luna

I have been learning for 100 Days! I feel older. I feel GOOD about my learning. I love playing with my friends.

I am proud of my learning, and I can read now. I am a good friend and love when I go outside to play with them.


Ellie

I am proud of my learning. There are lots of things you can learn at school. My favourite thing is learning to be a good friend.

Learning Team 3

During numeracy workshops we have been investigating time. This means we are learning how to tell the time on analogue clocks. For example, 15 minutes past 9 o'clock or quarter past 9. We've been learning how to tell digital time, for example 9:15am. We've even had a go at converting 12 hour time to 24 hour time, for example, at 9:15pm tonight it will be 2115 hours.

Measuring elapsed time means being able to figure out how many hours and minutes pass between one time and another time. For example, if it's 9:15am now, then in 3 hours and 35 minutes it will be lunch time.

Telling time is a skill that we use every day. But time hasn't always been measured by iPhones and clocks. Before people used clocks, they measured time with sundials, candles and hourglasses.

Here in Victoria, our First Nations people measure time in a different way. The Wathaurung people near Ballarat use stone arrangements to track changes throughout the year such as seasons and food availability.

While we've been learning about time, we have really enjoyed the challenge of calculating how old we are in months, weeks, days and even minutes! Some of us ended up sounding a lot older than we expected! Do you know how many minutes old you are? It will be different soon.

Learning Team 4

LT4 Debating

LT4's debating program has officially begun! A major highlight of our literacy learning this term is our Advanced Presentation Skills, seven week Debating course with Mrs Sandra de Geest. Every Thursday, students are spending 100 minutes with Mrs de Geest, learning about the features of a persuasive debate and working in teams to write their own arguments on particular topics. Each student will prepare and deliver at least one debate and will also take on other roles, such as chairperson, timekeeper and adjudicator.

This past week, our debaters have been preparing for the debate, "All plastic bags should be banned in Australia". Teams have been busily researching, choosing arguments and preparing rebuttals in order to be the most persuasive team. Each week there will be a new topic and new team. At the conclusion of our course,

students will be involved in our Debating Grand Finale where our most persuasive debaters will argue against each other. This epic showdown will take place on Thursday 29th of August during school time.

We look forward to watching our students develop into confident speakers with excellent argumentative skills – watch out parents!
