Yesterday we had the second day of our school review with our Reviewer, an Education Improvement Leader from the North Eastern Regional office and two local School Principals undertaking fieldwork. They spoke with team leaders about their curriculum planning and assessment, talked to some year 5/6 and 3/4 students about their learning and observed Literacy Workshops across the school. The panel looked at our achievement data (Naplan results as well as staff, student and parent surveys) which is very strong and in a majority of areas much stronger than 'Like/Network' schools, whilst our students were able to share their thinking by talking about their learning and reflecting upon their next steps.

Next week the review panel will help us to plan the strategic direction for the next 4 years by giving us specific feedback about their observations. This process is celebratory in many ways, but its core purpose is to ensure that we continue to strive for excellence by finding the 'next level of work' to support our teachers and young learners.

Please find attached the team newsletters for Term 4. These newsletters outline the focus areas for teaching and learning as well as diary dates and planned events. It is always a busy term so please add these dates to your diary quickly.

The first of our Prep Transition activities is scheduled for tomorrow for our new 2025 students and families. Please note that NO late orders will be accepted. A friendly reminder that our school does not accept cash for Book Club.


You must submit your order online.

Learning Team 3 Swimming

During the first two weeks of term, LT3 turned into water babies as we attended our Swimming Safety and Survival Program at Aqualink in Nunawading.

We learnt some vital swimming skills that have furthered our development and confidence in the pool such as:

- Treading water,
- Experiencing swimming with clothes on,
- Breathing techniques,
- Correct and efficient strokes for freestyle, backstroke and torpedo,
- Safe entry and exit from the water,

One of the days our main focus was swimming survival and safety skills. Some of the vital things we learnt were:

- Always swim with a trusted adult,
- Always swim between the red and yellow flags on patrolled beaches,
- Never dive in before knowing the depth of water,
- If you're in trouble, raise your hand high out of the water and yell "HELP!" as loud as you can,
- We also learnt skills about how to save someone from the edge of the water never jump in to help someone. Use something to reach them like a long stick, or throw them something inflatable.

Last but not least, on the last day it was Fun Friday! Some of the activities were:

- Relay races wearing firefighter hats with a rubber ducky on a boogie board,
- Pool Noodle Volleyball,
- Jumping off the diving blocks either from the block or on a rope.

We really enjoyed this experience and would like to thank our awesome teachers and Aqualink Nunawading for making it happen.

Remember - ALWAYS swim with a trusted adult, NEVER swim alone. Play it safe by the water!


